- H. The gym where you won't find any sports teams, but they do have endless student organizations.

- K. This building is home to the Chancellor and sits at the top of the Bascom hill.

- O. This peninsula used to be a working farm in the 1800s. Now students enjoy the view and opportunity to gather around large firepits to roast s'mores.
- P. A building where a whole new flock of Business Badgers will make their home here this fall.
- Q. Decorated sugar skulls are not actually Halloween decorations. Instead they used for Día de los Muertos or Day of the Dead celebrations. Can you find any sugar skulls?

- R. Feeling sick? A bit blue? Can't sleep? Or have the flu? This place will make you feel better!
- S. The land that Madison occupies is the ancestral home of the Ho-Chunk Nation. Go to the popular overlook of Mendota lake at the top of the hill and you will be able to see the burial mounds. Take a picture at the magnificent vista.
- T. Eventually, this building will house both hardwood and ice. In past years it has also been the gather space for Convocation.
- U. The big number shows the location of the Student Services Tower.
- V. Halloween is on October 31st and some people in the community decorate their homes with lots of decorations or with orange and black. Find your favorite decorations and take a selfie with them.
