


HOW TO GET A JOB ON CAMPUS

On-Campus Employment

- On-campus employment is defined as employment on the UW-Madison campus or employment at an offcampus location that is educationally affiliated with the university.
- During Fall/Spring semester, international student can work no more than 20 hours per week, During authorized vacation periods, you may work for more hours.

Someone might claim to find a job for you if you pay them money or provide a position with unreasonable high salary from an unofficial UW email address. Please carefully read the information on ISS website so you can identify a scam and know how to respond if you are targeted.






SOCIAL SECURITY NUMBER (SSN)

A Social Security number is only required if you work in the U.S. (even if you work oncampus) and can be obtained with proof of legal employment.
