716 Langdon St

- One of the most diverse buildings on campus where are identity-based offices - such as Latinx (LCC), Black (BCC) and Asian (APIDA)
- On the second floor, the Multicultural Student Center (MSC) has space available.

COLLEGE LIBRARY

600 N Park St

- With a coffee shop, computer labs, some silence-only rooms, and printing services
- Has the most general resources, such as DesignLab, and Librarians - specialized staff that can help you with your research
- Beautiful view of Lake Mendota

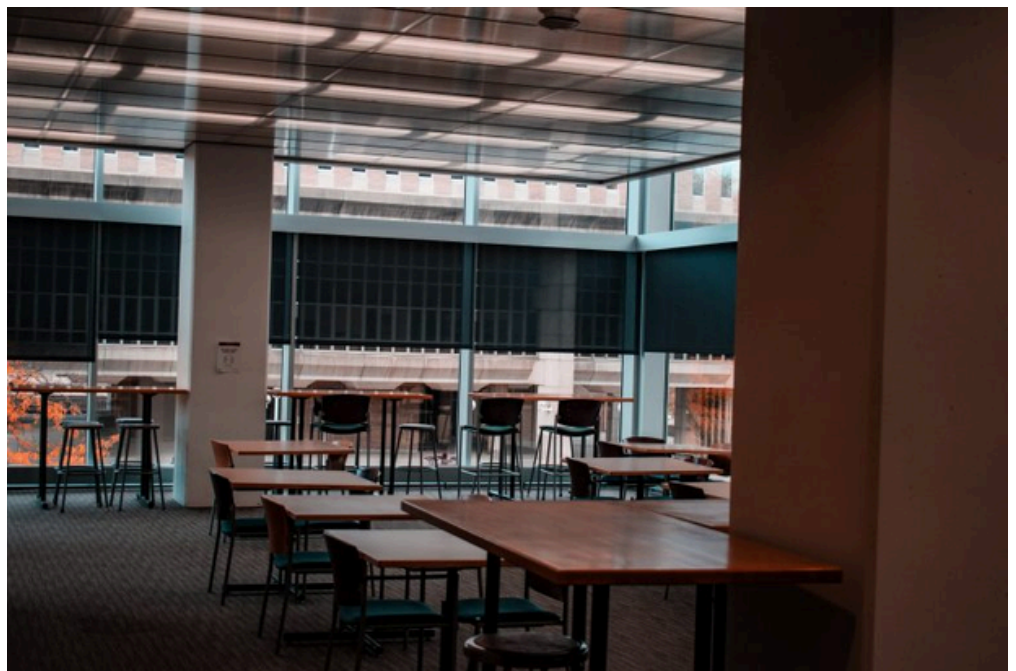




STUDENT ACTIVITY CENTER (THE SAC)
